

REPORT ON ASSESSMENT REGARDING PROCUREMENT OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT



1. INTRODUCTION

The Governance and Anti-Corruption unit was mandated by the Director-General: Department of Cooperative Governance to conduct assessment on the process followed to procure personal protective equipment (PPE) for the Department.

2. BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROCUREMENT DURING THE PERIOD OF COVID-19:

On 15 March 2020, President Cyril Ramaphosa announced the declaration of a national state of disaster following the World Health Organisation declaring the COVID-19 outbreak as pandemic as well as measures that must implemented by the nation. The Department of Public Service and Administration issued Circular 07 of 2020 that gives guidelines for the containment and management of the COVID-19 in the Public Service. The National Treasury issued various instructions since the disaster was declared for both PFMA and MFMA organs of state.

DCoG appointed Black Dot SA (Pty) Ltd to render cleaning, hygiene and pest control services in all five buildings for a period of 36 months. When the demand for Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) and supply of hygiene consumables increased during the outbreak of COVID-19, the Department opted for expansion of the scope of the current cleaning, hygiene and pest control services company, Black Dot SA (Pty) Ltd in line with applicable National Treasury Regulations. The scope will be extended for five months for monthly supply of surgical masks, gloves, hand sanitizers and dispenser refills.

Total expenditure is as follows:

- a) The Department appointed Black Dot SA (Pty) Ltd JV Bukuta Holdings (Pty) Ltd on the 28 May 2018 for provision of cleaning and hygiene services for a period of thirty- six (36) months with the total cost of R11,707,800.98.
- b) The process was executed through normal bidding process and the contract was signed on the 17 July 2018. The Department negotiated with the contracted service provider to also provide the Personal Protective Equipment in terms of Paragraph 3.5.1 (ii) and 3.7.3 of National Treasury SCM Instruction Note No. 08 of 2019/2020.

Total expenditure for the period March-July 2020:

- c) The two parties agreed and the contract with Black Dot SA (Pty) Ltd JV Bukuta Holdings (Pty) Ltd was variated/expanded in terms Paragraph 9.2 of National Treasury SCM Instruction No. 03 of 2016/17 and contract amount increased by R1,738,861.21.
- d) The Department also procured fourteen (14) infrared thermometers (body temperature scanners) through quotation process from Labex (Pty) Ltd Suppliers of Laboratory Equipment by deviating from normal Supply Chain Management procedures in terms of Paragraph 8.1 and 8.2 of National Treasury SCM Instruction No. 03 of 2016/17 and the total amount is R25,760.00.

4. SCOPE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSESSMENT

The objectives of the assessment were to determine:

- Identify any irregular expenditure and fruitless and wasteful expenditure relating to procurement of PPE;
- Ascertain whether any such irregularities are criminal in nature; and
- Ascertain if any losses were incurred.

8.1 Analysis of documents.

Cleaning, hygiene and pest control tender

- In 2018, the Department appointed Black Dot SA (PTY) Ltd to render cleaning, hygiene and pest control service in all five buildings for a period of 36 months, R 11 707 800.98.
- The SLA provider was not signed by the Department.

Personal Protective Equipment contract (Addendum not provided)

- The scope of the current cleaning, hygiene and pest control services provider, Black
 Dot SA (PTY) Ltd to provide the following:
 - Once-off supply and installation of 50 hand sanitizer dispensers and monthly refills in all DCoG buildings.
 - Monthly supply of surgical masks, gloves and hand sanitizers.
- The scope was extended for five months period (14 April August 2020) at total contact variation amount of R 1 738 861.24.
- It was indicated on the approved submission that the % of the above mentioned variation/expansion: R 1 738 861.24 / R 11 707 800.98 X 100 = 14.85%, which is less than fifteen percent (15%) of the original contract amount and that complies with National Treasury prescripts on increasing initial bid scope.

Emergency Procurement of PPE with petty cash

The Department has also utilized the petty cash to procure emergency PPE in line with in terms of paragraph 9 of the Petty Cash Management policy. Details of procure PPE listed below:
